2.2.3.1 pat の例

- (13) B: The cameraman is recording a "cut on action," which is centred on the little girl's hand as it reaches down to pat the goat. (CBP)
 - F: We don't want to make an art that pats people on the back. (CD6)
 - H:i. *Thomas's hand, patting her knee* reassuringly, did nothing to still her emotions. (FNT) ii. ..., *his hand* constantly fluttering to his mouth or *patting his greasy hair*. (H98)
 - M: ... had he been walking in the pleasure garden by himself, talking to the broken queen and patting the stone lioness on the head? (FRC)

2.2.3.2 slap の例

- (14) B: Her hand twitched on the rolled edge of the black silk scarf about her neck, clearly longed to rise and slap someone. (GUK)
 - E:i. The hand promptly slapped her on the neck. (ADF)

- b. I peeped in the wardrobe to see the dwarf. He was still there. Wow! He just woke and yawned. When he saw me, he was frightened and hid among my dresses. I told him to come out of the wardrobe and patted him on the head. When I touched him, he wasn't afraid anymore.
- c. Calem was born Oct. 5th, so he is just a little whipper snapper. He was fussing so I picked him up and put him on my shoulder and <u>patted his back</u>. That did the trick, he let out a big belch and spit up on my shoulder.
- d. Today in the grocery store, we saw a kid with a bike helmet that probably rode there on the back of his dad's bicycle. (The weather has been gorgeous lately.) Nico saw him, instantly divined the helmet's purpose, and patted his head.

2.5 まとめ

- ・人の「人」に関する認識には、「物理的な身体を持った人」と「意識体としての人」の二重性がある。
- ・身体の接触を含む動詞文において、「人」が目的語にあらわれた場合、単なる「物理的な身体を持った人」への対象接 触に加えて、「意識体としての人」への接触(メッセージ伝達意図)が重ね描きされている。
- ・前置詞句分離文では、接触部分が前置詞句で表され、「意識体としての人」への接触が前景となっている。一方、所有 格目的語文では、主語の身体行為の動きが前景となっており、「意識体としての人」への接触は背景へと後退している。

3.3 まとめ

- ・賞罰動詞文の目的語に現れる語には人の行為が背景でつながっている。(「人」でない目的語においては「人の行為」が 重なっている)
- ・賞罰動詞文で、「人」が目的語にあらわれた場合、「意識体としての人」への言語的な接触(賞罰の伝達)として解釈される。
- ・賞罰動詞文で現れる for 句は、言語的な接触(賞罰の伝達)を行う主語側からの「理由」を表しており、賞罰行為が等価に交換される事前の出来事を表す。

4. 接触動詞と賞罰動詞の関連について

- (67) a. When Cheney talked up current conditions in Iraq, Edwards <u>knocked</u> him for linking Saddam Hussein to Sept. 11.
 - b. Nobody <u>bashed</u> Bill Clinton for sending the military into Somalia without the UN authorization.
 - c. That's what Bill Maher did, with his famous "I love my country" speech, after he <u>was hammered</u> for calling the suicide bombers courageous.
 - d. A Liverpool nursery <u>was rapped</u> for taking snaps of children and putting them on the walls without their parents' consent.
 - e. Then Camp Clinton's damage control backfired as she <u>was pounded</u> for suggesting the "boys" ganged up on her.
- (68) a. bash/ batter/ hammer/ knock/ lash/ rap: 「たたく」=>「非難する」

praise -- pat

b. beat/ smash/ dash: 「たたく」=>「負かす」、「困らせる」、「くじく」

c. drum: 「たたく」=>「たたき込む、教え込む」

criticize -- slap

- d. bang/ bump/ smack/ tap/ thump/ whack: 擬態語系は意味の展開が希薄(?)
- (69) The police are investigating the food company a. for illegal records. (search for)
 - b. for making illegal records. (reason for)
 - c. for the illegal records it made.

5. まとめ

- ・身体の動きを伴う接触動詞において、「人」が目的語に現れる場合、人の人への何らかのメッセージ伝達意図が重ねられ、伝達意図を介しての人と人の関係を表す文となっている。
- ・賞罰動詞において、「人」が目的語に現れる場合、相手が係わる事前の出来事に対する交換として、主語側からの賞罰の伝達として解釈され、賞罰を介しての人と人の関係を表す文となっている。
